MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



The year 2021 has yet been difficult with the continued prevalence of the Covid -19 and the world is gearing to live a new normal. JA Mascareignes has not remained unscathed by these changes and challenges. Hence, JA Mascareignes' initiatives to challenge the status quo and revamp its programs have been crucial in its endeavour to meet its objectives.

Despite the lockdown in March 2021 and the closure of schools, JA Mascareignes reached out to 2,679 beneficiaries bringing it closer to its milestone of 100,000 participants.

Around 678 participants were reached through the online programs, which included the JA Mascareignes Online Financial Talk and the Work Readiness Program. The latter program has been implemented through a partnership with the University

This year, the flagship program of JA Mascareignes, the Mini Company of the Year (COY), was held completely virtual with the participation of 14 schools. We welcomed Project Management Institute Educational Foundation as a sponsor and for introducing Project Management in this year's curriculum.

Some main highlights of the year include:

- The launching of the JA Deep program, an online entrepreneurship program, on a pilot basis with 10 students
- Enhanced collaboration with NGOs and ANFEN schools, where a greater variety of programs has been offered.
- JA Mascareignes was announced as the host of the JA Africa Company of the Year Competition 2021
- JA Mascareignes was selected as a JA Worldwide Brand Leader, which entailed being among the first Member Nations to trial the new JA branding.
- As a focus on capacity building, the JA Mascareignes team participated in several courses and workshops to strengthen marketing and leadership skills

Amidst this difficult context, I thank our sponsors for believing in our actions and philosophy and for their committed funding. The total contribution from the sponsors increased by 42% from Rs 3.8m in 2020 to reach Rs 5.4m in 2021. With an effective cost management and an increase in funding, JAM closed the financial year 2021 on a positive note with a surplus of Rs 846,897.

I remain grateful to the JA Mascareignes team for their commitment and extend my thanks to my colleague board directors for their engagement and support.



JA Africa Company of the Year 2021

EG Company flew the Mauritian flag high in the Eswatini virtual sky, during the JA Africa Virtual Company of the Year Competition 2020. They won the Public Choice Award and finished on the podium, in third place, of the overall competition.

EG Company is a JA Company set up by 14 Grade 12 girls of Eden Girls College. Their goal is to sensitise people about the importance of protecting the environment. Their ambitious goal as a social enterprise is to plant 1.5 million plants by 2025. Their products are a Fashionable Facemask (see attached) and a sanitizer holder (see attached). EG Company won the JA Mini Company Final in 2020 and won the right to represent Mauritius at the JA Africa COY Competition. At the COY, they competed with 12 other JA Companies from the other Member Nations of JA Africa. They were assessed through their final report, a 5 mins PowerPoint Presentation and a 5mins Question and Answers session with the judges. They also had the opportunity to take part in a series of webinar.

JA Mascareignes Online Work Reaciness Programme



JA Mascareignes Online Work Readiness 2021 and the JA Mascareignes Online Financial Talk.

Has more than doubled its number of beneficiaries reached through its Online Programs in 2021 compared to 2020.

For Mrs. Lionnet, Executive Director of JA Mascareignes, "if we want to attract and keep the interest of the youth, we need to use the digital tools which are attractive to them. It is why at JA Mascareignes the digitalisation of our program is a priority. The success of this process is visible with the increase in the number of participants who have registered and completed our online programs in 2021".

The JA Mascareignes Online Work Readiness Program is an initiative where students aged 16-23 learn about key work-readiness skills in the comfort of their home. The aim of the program is to equip the participants with the necessary skills to get and keep a job. The program is in the format of 5 Zoom sessions, by JA Mascareignes staff, complemented by a team activity using WhatsApp and Google Slides, and fun quizzes using Kahoot. Thanks to the advances in the platforms used for this program, a participant can now complete the JA Mascareignes Online Work Readiness Program, using only his/her phone.

The **JA Mascareignes Online Financial Talk**, is an online workshop on money management. It is the digital version of the 'Managing Your Money Smartly' program and was first run during the Global Money Week 2021.

Mauritian students shine at JA Europe Foodathon 2021



JA Mascareignes' young representatives flew the Mauritian flag high, in the virtual European sky, at the World Food Day (WFD) Foodathon. JA Mascareignes had 5 teams of 3 students that took part. They each gave their best while learning how to collaborate with other students from Europe and Africa. One of the Mauritian group was part of the team that won the "Food Waste and Loss" challenge.

The **World Food Day (WFD) Foodathon**, was a project organised by EIT Food and Junior Achievement Europe, in partnership with EUROPEN and with the support of Bayer. The Foodathon was an intensive two-day Innovation Camp between 13th-15th of October 2021, aiming to solve specific agri-food challenges and lead to the generation of new business ideas/business propositions.

The Foodathon aimed to raise awareness among young generations of the significant challenges facing our food systems today, to help young talent gain entrepreneurial skills and acquire the confidence to become potential future entrepreneurs in the agri-food sector.

JA ITS TYME in collaboration with Eco Sud

JA Mascareignes partnered with Eco-Sud for the implementation of the JA ITS TYME program in Mahebourg. Eco-Sud has since 2020 set up a series of support activities and programs to help those who have been affected by the Wakashio Disaster. The JA ITS TYME aims at equipping the beneficiaries with the necessary tools to successfully start and run their business.

The training started back in March 2021 with a group of around 20 participants. The session had to be put on hold during the lockdown period and restarted in mid-June 2021. The participants were divided into two group of 8 and 9 respectively so as to respect the Covid-19 safety measures.

JA ITS TYME in collaboration with Ciel Foundation

JA Mascareignes has completed the JA ITS TYME Program with two batches of aspiring entrepreneurs in the south east region. The participants learned how to start and run a business. In total 10 aspiring entrepreneurs were trained.

This program was made possible through a collaboration with Ciel Foundation, La Vallée de Ferney and Caritas Notre Dame des Anges.

JA Programs in MITD with the New Zealand High Commission





Junior Achievement (JA) Mascareignes has collaborated with the New Zealand High Commission for the implementation of JA Programs with the students following vocational training at the Mauritius Institute of Training and Development and the Adolescent Non-Formal Education Network (ANFEN) schools.

The participants will learn key Entrepreneurship, Financial Literacy and Work Readiness skills that will help them to transition from the classroom to playing an active role in the Mauritian economy. The curriculum offered by JA complement the training provided by the MITD and ANFEN. The two institutions welcome students that have fallen out of the mainstream educational system of Mauritius.

The programs being implemented are the following:

- JA More than Money: The participants learn about the role of money in the everyday life of an individual and of a business.
- JA Our City: The program teaches participants about the role of money in a city. It also teaches them about the contribution made by financial institutions and how they help business and people achieve their economic goals.
- JA ITS TYME: Teaches key entrepreneurship skills required to start and run a business.
- JA Success Skills: The program equips the participants with the necessary tools to get and keep a job.

The implementation of the program will continue in 2022 and will impact a total of 1,050 young people aged between 13 and 20 years old.
