Visit on the Oct 11, 2023

The meeting was called in order to assess the current progress of the JA GREENT Program. It was attended by a delegation of 5 representatives from MOL and 3 representatives from JA Mascareignes, Laurence, Anousha, and Claretha.



During the meeting, Anousha delivered a presentation on JA Mascareignes, which was subsequently followed by Laurence's presentation on the program. The collaboration for the contextualization involved Ms. Vera Petkanchin and Mr. Vassen Kauppaymuthoo.

The Contextualization process encompassed several key activities: Workshops(April -September 2023): JA Mascareignes staff participated in the initial workshop to gain insights

into the sustainability facing Mauritius.

Meeting for Needs assessment:

Subsequent meetings took place between JA Staff, Vera and Vassen to comprehensively understand our program's specific requirements and tailor it accordingly.

Contextualization workshops:

Specialized workshops were conducted involving Vera and Vassen to fine-tune and customize the program based on the gathered insights and requirements.



Two schools have been chosen for the pilot implementation of the customized program. A 'Train the Trainer' session, scheduled for November 7th 2023, will be conducted by Vera and Vassen, aiming to give teachers the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively implement the program in the selected schools.

Claretha provided an overview of the JA GREENT Program, including the structure, expected outcomes, and interactive elements. She detailed the various activities that would be integrated into the instructional periods. These activities are designed to actively engage students, creating an interactive and participatory learning experience.

Dinner at the Japanese Ambassador

On 11 October, 3 JA Staff were invited for a dinner at the Japanese Ambassador's residence. The Ambassador made a welcome speech and after the dinner, everyone had the chance to introduce their organization and MOL funded project.
